Programme Overview

Our MSc Project Management is an industry inspired programme that uses a Practice Based Learning approach to project management development. The programme is delivered through a fully distance-learning approach. The PMDL differs from other courses in that, rather than simply acquiring new knowledge and ideas, delegates are expected to adpot a reflective practice approach so that their learning can inform and be informed by their practises of managing projects in the workplace. The programme acts as a Community of Practice for delegates to network and communicate with their peers so that they can share experiences and practices across a wide array of organisations and project environments.

- Candidates must have undertaken their Undergraduate degree in English OR hold a recognised English Language certificate such as IELTS or TOEFL.
- Professional experience will be considered to support your application, particularly if you
 do not have a first degree.
